

Dr. R. O. Gilbert Synanon Group Speakers Honored for Work In Controlling TB Due at Kiwanis Meeting

VAN NUYS—Van Nuys Kiwanis Club will hear talks by representatives of the Synanon Foundation this noon at its meeting in the American Legion clubhouse, 1541 Sylvan St.

Synanon Foundation maintains a home used to house and rehabilitate 70 narcotics addicts in Santa Monica.

The group uses no drugs or medicine in treating its tenants. Instead, it depends on the interchange of sympathy and understanding for its success.

Because of its unusual method of treating these addicts the Synanon Foundation has run into legal difficulties as to its operation without the use of medicine and also because of its location in a non-hospitalized area.

It is these problems among others which will be discussed.

Synanon maintains its activity of self help for the tenants does not violate any health or safety code and that it offers no medicine, so it should not be classified as a hospital.

Atty. William Dentzel will act as chairman of the day and introduce the speakers.
