

## Synanon Cure for Addicts Moves Into San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 30

—A group devoted to the permanent cure of narcotics addicts has set up a headquarters in San Francisco.

The group now operates four Synanon Houses—in Santa Monica, San Diego, Reno, Nev., and Westport, Conn.—where addicts reside and work together. According to the organization, about 300 persons have been cured.

Municipal Judge Leland Lazarus was elected president of the Sponsors of Synanon for the San Francisco area this week at a meeting of local civic leaders. He predicted that San Francisco would have its own Synanon House in a few weeks to accommodate 150 addicts.
